#### **CURRENCY EXCHANGE (AS OF MAY 7)**

1 EUR = 5.8 Hryvnia (UHR) 1 USD = 5.3 Hryvnia (UHR)

#### **PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION**

Metro/subway is efficient, inexpensive and covers almost entire city. To pay, buy tokens at the stations and insert before entering.

#### TAXI

Best to negotiate price before entering vehicle. Best to use marked taxis at night. Taxi to airport no more than \$30.

# **Priorities for Convention Implementation**



## WWF/CEI PRIORITIES for IMPLEMENTATION of the CARPATHIAN CONVENTION

To ensure that long-term sustainable development of the Carpathians mainly benefits local people and communities, and stops the ongoing trends of increasing poverty, unemployment, rural depopulation and loss of traditional practices, we propose that Carpathian governments:

- Explicitly integrate conservation and the sustainable use of biological and landscape diversity into national sector policies such as agriculture, forestry, river basin (and flood) management, tourism, transport and energy, industry and mining.
- 2. Establish a Carpathian Network of Protected Areas, including the 30 Carpathian Priority Areas identified by the Carpathian Ecoregion Initiative (CEI), each with an effective, participatory management system.
- 3. Ensure the preservation of endangered species listed in the CEI s List of Endangered Carpathian Species, especially through the maintenance of their habitats, with assurance that populations of large carnivores are maintained at viable levels.

- 4. Promote FSC certification of forests with implementation in all state forests; develop and implement the High Conservation Value Forest concept as part of sustainable forestry management schemes; and strengthen enforcement measures against illegal logging.
- 5. Implement programmes enabling local populations to derive economic benefit from traditional and sustainable land-use and tourism practices that protect the high biological diversity of the Carpathian Mountains
- **6.** Strengthen the capacities of countries to effectively use Environmental Assessments and ensure that new transportation, energy and mining activities do not negatively impact endangered species or fragment priority natural areas.

We call on the signatories to ensure that the Convention moves towards swift implementation, with adequate annual funding contributions and a concrete workplan agreed within two years of signing.

This list has been developed by WWF (World Wide Fund for Nature) and CEI (Carpathian Ecoregion Initiative) as their key priorities for implementation of the Carpathian Convention. It was released on May 22, 2003 with the official signing of the Carpathian Convention during the 5th Environment for Europe Conference held in Kyiv, Ukraine.

# Save Europe's only living delta!



The Danube Delta, where the Danube River meets the Black Sea in Ukraine and Romania, is the only "living delta" in Europe. With natural processes constantly reshaping its geography, the Danube Delta is truly a natural wonder. It is also the largest reedbed in the world and home to a fantastic array of species including sturgeon and Europe's largest colonies of pelicans.

In 1976, the USSR declared part of the Ukraine Delta a Ramsar site, reconfirmed by Ukraine in 1995. In August 1998, UNESCO created a Biosphere Reserve in the Ukraine Delta to protect this natural treasure. Now the delta is threatened.

Some people want a canal for ships from the Danube to the Black Sea in Ukraine. Some people want it to go through a core zone of the Delta at a place called Bystroye. This could ecologically devastate the Delta. But other options exist.

WWF and others have asked the Ukraine government to ensure that all options are properly assessed and publicly reviewed to select the one that is the least ecologically destructive. You can ask them too

## Save Europe's beautiful Drava!



The Drava River in Croatia is home to a magnificent array of natural wonders including the Danube Basin's second largest floodplain, the biggest natural spawning grounds for fish in Central Europe and a resting stop for endangered species such as black storks and white-tailed eagles.

The Croatian government both helps and hurts the Drava. They are especially helping, with World Bank support,

the beautiful Kopacki Rit Park where the Drava meets the Danube. And Croatia's Prime Minister has made promotion of the Drava's natural values a priority. But further upstream, they have been changing the Drava into concrete. Large amounts of gravel are extracted directly from the river, much to help build a new highway. Also, the government continues its construction of small and large dams, literally choking life from the river. This is not helping their recent application to join the EU.

WWF and others have asked the Croatian government to protect the entire Drava in Croatia, not just part if it. You can ask them too (see back).
