

Unique Problem

The Baltic Sea is one of the most unique marine ecosystems in the world.

Not only is the Baltic Sea home to rich levels of biodiversity and wildlife, but it sustains the livelihoods and economies of millions of people in the nine coastal countries who also call the Baltic Sea region home.

The Baltic Sea, however, has paid a heavy price from decades of human activity in and around the sea – overfishing, irresponsible shipping practices, physical exploitation and the pressures from agriculture and industry continue to negatively impact its sensitive environment.

As a result, the Baltic is now one of the most threatened marine ecosystems on the planet.

Unique Solution

A comprehensive strategic plan to coordinate the multiple demands on the Baltic Sea has been sorely missing for years. Sadly, despite many efforts to 'save the Baltic', it is clear that the current patchwork of government approaches and regulatory frameworks in and around the Baltic have proved inadequate. Despite our best efforts, the Baltic remains in serious jeopardy.

The Baltic Sea deserves better. In order to reverse the current negative environmental trends, real leadership, immediate concerted action and a new approach is urgently needed. WWF believes that in order to achieve the dramatic results the Baltic Sea needs, this new approach must include:

- One integrated, legally-binding governance framework for the entire Baltic Sea.
- Real leadership secured through political commitment at the highest possible level.
- A holistic, integrated, cross-sectoral and ecosystem-based process that includes all countries, sectors and relevant stakeholders.
- A clear implementation plan with concrete and concerted actions identified with secured budgets and on-going review mechanisms in place.

Unique Commitment

The presidents and prime ministers of the nine Baltic Sea countries share the responsibility of creating a strong vision for the Baltic Sea – a vision which will ensure that the vitality of the Baltic Sea environment is restored and that the Baltic region remains dynamic and vibrant in terms of economic growth and development.

Let us re-establish the Baltic Sea's tradition of environmental stewardship.

The Baltic Sea provides a fantastic opportunity to showcase a truly integrated approach to conservation and sustainable development. Success will require leadership, action and commitment from all levels of society. The Baltic Sea needs:


- Politicians who take sound decisions and implement them.
