I. Mission of WWF Singapore:

II. Major Functions:

The Head of Conservation Resource will develop and implement conservation related market transformation that will enhance the WWF brand profile and positioning as well as support the Communications / Corporate Engagement / Fundraising teams at WWF Singapore.

III. Major Duties and Responsibilities:

- Understand the conservation-related opportunities and threats to Singapore vis-à-vis network conservation priority and advise the WWF – Singapore senior management team.
- Plan and strategize to select suitable conservation programmes that can best support donor / corporate aspirations in the areas of Climate Change, Palm Oil, Pulp, Paper, Timber, Sustainable Seafood, Illegal Wildlife Trade and Species Conservation.
- Work with the Corporate sector on sustainability and market transformation initiatives in at transforming business practices.
- Network and dialogue with the relevant Singapore government agencies on the local and regional issues, as well as sustainability in general.
- Provide key conservation messaging, human interest stories to Fundraising department for donor acquisition and retention campaigns
- Work closely with the conservation and communication teams from country offices of WWF Singapore funded projects.

IV. Profile:

Required qualifications:

- Master's degree in Environmental Science/Sustainability, Natural Sciences/Engineering, Economics/Business or related field
- Technical proficiency in the field of nature conservation and natural resource management, preferably in the Markets, Forests or Marine sectors.
- Experience of working with and influencing Singapore/Asian business and government
- At least 10 years of professional experience, with a minimum of 3 years in a leadership position, in programme / project planning / implementation
- A good understanding of the WWF network or other organizations in the conservation sector is an advantage

Required skills and competencies:

- Ability to think strategically
- In depth knowledge of conservation and environmental sustainability issues, and how business and government functions in the Singapore / Asian context
- Excellent communication skills in both written and spoken English
- Excellent interpersonal skills, including the ability to develop and maintain strong relationships at all levels, within WWF Singapore and with external stakeholders
- High level of competency in analysing and communicating technical information in a simple succinct manner
- Ability to liaise effectively with local communities and governments at different levels
