Illegal logging accounts for 50 - 90% of the volume of all forestry in key producer tropical countries

Illegal logging accounts for 15 – 30% of global logging activities

Illegally taken timber is estimated to be worth US\$30 and US \$100 billion annually.







NAIROBI, Kenya (AP) — The illegal cutting of timber and the poaching of elephants and rhinos are part of a "rapidly escalating environmental crime wave" that international governments must combat by increasing cooperation, police and environmental officials said.

Amur Tiger Habitat Threatened





Data revealed that in 2010, the volume of Mongolian oak logged for export exceeded the amount legally authorized for logging by 200 percent. This means at least half of the oak shipped across the border to China was stolen. Oak harvest in 2007 and 2007 was four times as large.






