16 January - WWF and other NGOs applauded Spain's new fisheries law, which imposes stronger penalties on in pirate fishing.




15 January - WWF extended warm congratulations to the movie Virunga that highlights the tremendous challenges to conservation in Africa's oldest and most biodiverse national park.

NO to gas project on Coto Doñana site

The Unesco and Natura 2000 site of Coto Doñana in Spain is threatened by a gas exploitation project. It could indeed be authorised by the Andalusian Government following a claim by Gas Natural-Fenosa of €358m euros for blocking the project.
