Integrated Ocean Governance Project Liaison Officer Solomon Islands

WWF Solomon Islands (WWF-SI) and IUCN Oceania Regional Office (IUCN-ORO) with support from the South Pacific Regional Environment Program (SPREP) aim to provide ongoing technical support to the Solomon Island Government to deliver on its efforts on Integrated Oceans Governance.

The four year Project is funded through the Pacific-European Union Marine Partnerships (PEUMP) Program. The Pacific-European Union Marine Partnership (PEUMP) Program is a multi-partner project that aims to improve the economic, social and environmental benefits for 15 Pacific-African Caribbean Pacific states through stronger regional economic integration and the sustainable management of natural resources and the environment.

This role will support the ongoing development and implementation of a Marine Spatial Plan in the Solomon Islands.
