Tuna Fisheries Officer -WWF-Pacific Solomon Islands (SI)

WWF, the global conservation organization is seeking to recruit a Tuna Fisheries Officer who will report directly to the Country Manager, Solomon Islands for day to day issues. The position holder will work closely with WWF-Pacific SI Staff, WWF-Pacific Papua New Guinea (PNG), PNA Fisheries Officer, WWF-Pacific PNG Tuna Fisheries Policy Officer, WWF-Pacific Sustainable Fisheries and Seafood Programme staff, the WWF Network Initiatives working within the region – Coral Triangle Programme, Smart Fishing and Global Shark Initiative.

The position will be based in WWF's SI office and will be required to work in collaboration with WWF'S PNG country office for implementation of activities in Solomon Islands in relation to tuna fisheries.
